
GRAPHIC PRESENTATION OF DATA

In the EQAO test, the way that data or information is presented to students varies. Here are three methods of data presentation that require special attention:

BAR GRAPH



Every graph must have a title ("Crayons"), a description of what is shown in the x-axis and y-axis ("Numbers of Crayons," "Colours of Crayons") and,

if necessary a legend (see following page: "Each



represents three apples eaten.)

A question about this graph might be, "How many red crayons?" The student needs to find red, see that the bar ends at 12, and thus knows that the graph represents 12 red crayons.



How many black crayons?

The student needs to find black, see that the bar ends between 8 and 10, and then "figure out" that the answer is 9.
