Below is the Generic Reading Rubric provided by the Ministry of Education and used by EQAO officials to develop specific rubrics for open-ended questions on the EQAO test.

Generic Reading Rubric for EQAO Assessment

1	illegible: cannot be read; completely crossed out/erased; not written in English
	irrelevant content: does not attempt assigned question (e.g., comment on the task, drawings, "?", "I", "I don't know")

10	response indicates a significant misunderstanding of the reading selection; ideas and information from the reading selection are inaccurate.
20	response addresses only part of the question
