

Curriculum Expectations for Junior Kindergarten

With the help of activities in this unit, children will:


- print most of the letters of the alphabet and demonstrate an understanding that letters represent sounds (use phonics);
- follow simple directions;
- identify and talk about their own interests and preferences (e.g., favourite activities, toys, stories);
- use a variety of materials to communicate information (e.g., illustrations, graphs)
- identify and reproduce simple patterns; create and extend simple patterns using a variety of materials or actions;
- recognize and use patterns;
- recognize and write numerals from one to ten; count orally to ten; use simple grids correctly;
- collect, display and interpret data in daily activities; express their feelings of wonder and curiosity about the world;
- identify ways in which people use the natural environment; identify patterns and cycles in their daily lives (eq; changes in weather);
- identify patterns and cycles in the natural world; describe different kinds of weather and the ways in which people adapt to the weather (e.g., by wearing light clothing in summer);
- show skill in cutting and pasting; use a variety of materials in creating art works.



#### School Bus Safety



Read and discuss the following safety rules with your child.


If you take a bus to school, you will need to know some important bus safety rules.

- 1. Wait for the bus at your bus stop. Stand away from the road.
- When the bus stops, the bus driver will open the door. Climb up the steps carefully.
- Walk to a seat and sit down. Stay in your seat until the bus arrives at school. Always sit facing the front of the bus.
- Always keep your hands and head inside the bus. Do not lean out of an open window.
- 5. Do not eat or drink on the bus. Keep your snacks and drinks inside your backpack.
- When the bus arrives at school, walk down the aisle and go carefully down the steps.







#### Reading With Your Child: Motivation



- Read with children often, from a very early age. Find a special place or time to read together.
- 2. Encourage children to choose the books that you read together.
- Look at the pictures in the book. Discuss with your child how the pictures relate to the story.
- 4. Read books that use repetition or rhyme. Encourage your child to read along with you.
- Read books more than once. Children often enjoy hearing the same story over and over.
- 6. Start a collection of books for your child. Encourage your child to take care of the books.
- 7. Allow children time to explore books by themselves.
- 8. Visit a bookstore with your child. Point out the variety of books and topics.
- 9. Visit the public library. Allow children to choose books for themselves. Don't forget to select books for yourself!
- Participate in programs offered at the public library (e.g., story time).
- 11. Have a basket of books in the bathroom.


#### Field Trips and Extension Activities


